

W.E.B. in a nutshell

W.E.B. regards itself as an international energy transition and community participation company with a vision. The company works constantly to play a leading role in decentralizing the energy transition. The energy transition describes the process of moving away from fossil fuels and continuing to develop renewable energy sources. W.E.B. is an active combatant in the war against climate change.

The W.E.B. business model is based on the three pillars of project development, power plant operations and electricity marketing. Community participation provides the foundation for these endeavors. The company was founded by individuals who were so excited by the potential of renewables that they financed the first wind power installations almost entirely out of their own pockets. Today, W.E.B. remains true to this concept of broad public involvement in electricity production. The company's growth is based on a process of expanding the equity base via stock issues and corporate loans. In this way, W.E.B. has grown to become an unlisted company with a broad shareholder base.

W.E.B. develops power station projects from the planning stage through to construction and operates power stations with a focus on wind and solar power. The generated power is then sold indirectly via electricity traders, electricity providers and, where designated statutory framework conditions for green energy are in place, via national settlement organizations, and directly to business and private customers.

WEB Windenergie AG, based in Pfaffenschlag near Waidhofen an der Thaya, Austria, is the parent company of the W.E.B. Group. W.E.B. is active in eight countries across Europe and North America: Austria, Germany, France, Italy, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Canada and the United States. W.E.B. employs local teams in these countries that focus primarily on the development and acquisition of new projects. The operation of all the company's power stations around the world is centrally coordinated and monitored from Austria.

In all countries where the company is active, W.E.B. is a member of national associations for wind and solar power, such as Austria's IG Windkraft and Photovoltaik Austria.
